

## Appendix 1: Further Dashboard Details.

1. **Police data** – This was taken from [www.police.uk/suffolk](http://www.police.uk/suffolk) which shows detailed specifics of crime data month to month for the last year. The 'Total Crime by Road' section of this month's dashboard shows in descending order, streets or roads where crime is most prevalent according to recorded crime incidents; these roads may not necessarily contain the most serious crime, but they do show those roads where some form of crime is most common. In order to protect anonymity, the data is released as 'on or near' the particular road.
  
2. **Anti-Social Behaviour** – This data is also taken from [www.police.uk/suffolk](http://www.police.uk/suffolk) and the monthly ASB statistic are generally categorised by one of these 3 definitions:
  - **Personal** – Where ASB is perceived to be targeted at an individual or group rather than the community at large. Examples could be verbal abuse, gestures, obscene phone calls/malicious communications, nuisance neighbours, trespassing, harassment.
  - **Nuisance** – Where ASB is causing trouble, annoyance or suffering to the community at large rather than just an individual or group. Examples could be boy racers, begging, drunken/rowdy behaviour, urinating in public, prostitution related activity, street drinking, inconsiderate parking.
  - **Environmental** – Where ASB is not aimed at an individual or group but targets the wider environment e.g. public spaces/buildings. Examples could be vandalism/graffiti, littering, fly tipping, abandoned vehicles, drugs paraphernalia.
