

North West Area Action Plan

The North West Area Committee will work to alleviate deprivation within the wards of Castle Hill, Whitehouse and Whitton. The areas of deprivation are described by the [Department of Communities and Local Government](#).

For 2017-18 the North West Area Committee will prioritise action to alleviate deprivation in the domains of **Education, Skills and Training, Health and Disability and Income.**

The North West Area Committee will seek to further the aims of the Council in improving the town for residents as described in [BUILDING A BETTER IPSWICH: THE COUNCIL'S CORPORATE PLAN](#).

For 2017-18 the North West Area Committee will prioritise action in line with the following Council aims and activities;

An enjoyable place to live and work

We want Ipswich to be an attractive place to live, work and study. Key to this is a high quality arts, leisure and culture offer delivered by the council and its partners

Working in partnership with other agencies to help address health inequalities in the NW area	
Engage with girls to enable them to access sporting or other types of suitable activities	The free activities during holidays was designed by the sports team to have better uptake from girls, and included girl only activities.
Engage with young people in the NW area	BLT has a young people's sub group, which is supporting Westbourne Radio. Members of the committee to get a slot on the radio show.
Working with Whitton Youth Partnership which has been supported by a funding contribution from the committee to recruit a Youth Worker for the area.	The Youth Worker, Andy Fell, is in post and he has consulted with young people on what they would like to see in the North West.
Help people to age well in all three wards	BLT have a Seniors sub group who are now meeting at Paddy Gere House Dementia friends Café. Has opened in Whitehouse
Help prevent people falling in to debt	Working with BLT and Eastern Savings & Loans credit union.
Look into foodbanks at local supermarkets	Many supermarkets have collection points for people to donate. There are some supermarkets that donate out of date food to local charities like the Teapot project
